## Job boost during COVID-19

Merri Health has received an employment boost with the introduction of 16 new roles.

The six-month roles will respond to changing community needs during the COVID-19 pandemic, with a focus on community and administrative support, engagement and wellbeing initiatives.

Merri Health's chief executive Tassia Michaleas said the boost will bring some relief to locals.

"The new roles provide an opportunity for those that were left unemployed to get back to work, and support our teams to offer a COVID-safe workplace."

The employment boost comes as a result of the Victorian Government's Working for Victoria scheme that will create more than 3,000 jobs in critical community-support organisations.

## Fawkner tests 7,000+ people

Over three weeks in July. Fawkner's coronavirus (COVID-19) drive-through test site processed more than 7.800 tests.

Supported by Merri Health, the test site was set-up in response to the high number of COVID-19 positive cases in northern metropolitan Melbourne. It provided locals with an opportunity to get tested close to home.

Merri Health continue to

support the COVID-19 test site at Fawkner, which is now a walk-in service from 10am -4pm, 7 days per week at Sports Hall, CB Smith Reserve 79 Jukes Road, Fawkner

Testing is done by clinicians from partnering clinics, and supported by the Department of Health and Human Services and Moreland Council.

## Wellness at Merri - helping our staff stay happy and well

### COVID-19: what to expect at your next visit

Merri Health has new COVID-19 screening measures in place for clients visiting four of our sites for face-to-face appointments at:

- 93 Bell St. Coburg
- 79 Jukes Rd. Fawkner
- 11 Glenlyon Rd. Brunswick
- 5D Cromwell St. Glenroy

Before entering these sites, you will be asked whether you are unwell or have a fever, about your travel history and whether vou have had close contact with a confirmed COVID-19 case. You will also have your temperature checked.


If we have any COVID-19 concerns, we will let you know - please follow our team member's instructions.

These processes have been introduced to keep you, our team and broader community safe and well. We will have these measures in place until further notice and will be guided by the Chief Medical Officer and official Government advice before easing screenings across our sites.

### A new program to help you manage chronic conditions

Be Well. Live Well is a new program for anyone 18 years and over that has a chronic illness like diabetes and asthma, and would like support to live as healthy as possible.

The program is now being held via telehealth (phone call or video conferencing) and is now taking one-on-one appointments.

We offer education, support and exercise programs to help you manage your health.

This program is suitable for people who have, or are at risk of, chronic cardiac or respiratory disease or diabetes, or people who need to change their lifestyle.

## Sooner or Later: school starting age in Fawkner

A research project: what is the impact of the school starting age in Fawkner?

Ready, Set, Prep! is a Merri Health initiative that prepares children and their families for a great start to primary school. Earlier this year, the team completed a research project to better understand the impact the school starting age in Fawkner has on children and their families.

The study reviewed data from local schools (sample of 182) and collected findings from consultations with more than 50 Fawkner locals.

Key findings were that Fawkner children start school at a statistically significant earlier age than the Victorian and Moreland average, and that it is linked to families having a Language Other Than English (LOTE) background and/or additional needs.

Understanding this trend, the team have made a number of recommendations to better support local children and their families through their first year of school. Stand outs include:

- the need for extra community-based program or initiatives to provide families with support and information
- linking education providers with community leaders so they can influence social norms
- linking families with local carer services to support children with extra needs.



## Be school-ready: watch the video series

## Video series supports school readiness in Fawkner.

The Ready, Set, Prep! educational video series and materials have been released on Merri Health's Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn accounts.

The videos are part of the larger Ready, Set, Prep! initiative to support children and families in Fawkner to have a great start to primary school. As part of the project, schools, kindergartens and early years settings in Fawkner provided feedback that they wanted a sustainable resource that shared key educational messages with community, to support children to have the best start in life and at primary school.

Through a six-month consultation with families and early years services in Fawkner, a video series answering some of the most common questions about starting school was chosen as the preferred resource. This would also be something the community could share for years to come.

During the consultation, many newly arrived families shared their experiences about starting school in Victoria. We found that families want the best for their children, but aren't always sure about how to access or enrol in many early years health and education services.

"There are huge gaps for migrants, they don't have much information about the school system here and they can struggle to find the

information," said Henna\*, a local parent.

From July to December 2019. families, schools, kindergartens and early years settings supported filming of the videos. Over two huge days, 72 people were involved in the filming across 12 locations in Fawkner. The messages in the videos were then edited and refined following a second round of consultation with the community in early 2020. In total, over 200 local community members and staff in early years health and education settings in Fawkner have contributed to the co-design, filming and editing of the series.

The Ready, Set, Prep! partnership, made up of over 20 local schools, kindergartens and early years services, are hoping these videos will be used and shared to support early childhood health, wellbeing and development. These videos are just one of the many strategies the partnership is working on to increase the number of children starting school 'ready' and developmentally on track in Fawkner.

We respond to the health needs of our communities through a range of initiatives. Our organisation-wide initiatives take place across Victoria


Initiatives by our community wellbeing team are based in Moreland, with a focus on Fawkner.
